In its 38th year, the enthusiastic and colourful rendering of the conventional formula maintained its traditional appeal to the traditional audience. This year the theme was "Wild West", loosely based on Diamond Lil's saloon, and the antics of its patrons. A quick survey pre performance and at interval elicited overwhelmingly positive responses of regular attendance and intense loyalty to the format, regardless of minor changes. Thank you for the generous donation of \$1,000 made by members of your organisation recently. Our receipt is enclosed for your records.

The RFDS is a major part of Tasmania's health infrastructure and relies heavily on donations from individuals and organisations such as yours to keep a presence in the State.

We have a long and proud history in our state, as the RFDS was established in Tasmania in 1960, using single engine aircraft chartered from Tasmanian aero clubs. Our first flight was the transportation of a patient from Queenstown to Launceston.

Today, an average of 3 critically ill patients are transported each day. That's over 1000 patients each year. Your support allows us to continue to reach people throughout Tasmania and the Bass Strait Islands.

Donations such as yours will enable us to buy essential items to enhance the service in Tasmania: such as special cots to move babies; to build a drive-through shelter at Wynyard Airport, so that patients can be transferred into the plane undercover; and we have recently purchased a new dental chair at the Flinders Island medical centre.

I would be grateful if you would extend our thanks to the Rotary Club of Wynyard members for their support of The Royal Flying Doctor Service (Tasmanian Section).
