Bags of Hope to Swaziland

ShelterBox Founder and CEO Tom Henderson together with volunteer ShelterBox Response Team members have just returned from Swaziland after overseeing the distribution of 32,000 ShelterBox school rucksacks to AIDS orphans. ShelterBox is working on this special project with the Piers Simon Appeal. Piers was killed in the Tsunami in 2004 and his family set up this initiative in his memory.

SRT member Becky Maynard says 'ShelterBox undertook this deployment in 2008 providing urgently needed shelter for child and grandparent-headed families, left parent-less by HIV/AIDS which has devastated the region. There is a real need to bring some hope to the children of this small African nation and, in partnership with the Piers Simon Appeal, ShelterBox took on the challenge. Over 32,000 bags each containing pencils, pens, maths sets and a metal cup, plate and spoon were packed by our Volunteers.

These packs will assist greatly with the education program – the children are keen and motivated but have little or nothing to support this enthusiasm.'
