Our Guest Speaker, Tracey Bradley spoke briefly about the history of the Spencer Adult Day Care Centre, its move from Wynyard and how it will now be coming back to here. It caters for about 60 people so it is a well utilised service in our community. Waratah-Wynyard Council recently received a grant of \$35,000 towards the upgrading of a venue for this facility. The Guide Hall was identified as the most suitable. Guides do use it on a limited basis and Meals on Wheels also operates from here. The \$35,000 will only go part way in bringing the building up to a required level and so Somerset Rotary, Wynyard Rotary and the Lions Club have also been asked to

contribute \$5000 each and in kind work such as volunteers for painting etc. Lions and Somerset Rotary have committed \$5,000 each. Tracey was thanked by Sue for her most informative talk.
