MUSIC HALL FORUM - CHAIRED BY GRAEME SAWARD

Graeme opened the forum stating that it had been a show that was very well received with good content. The venue for rehearsals worked out very well and it is better to have the business relationship we now have with the Wharf Hotel than the previous one.

Graeme read a report prepared by Beth Bessel. Just a couple of points from this. The Advocate advertising (which costs about \$500 per ad) did not seem to generate sufficient sales and there did not seem to be a surge of sales with the radio 'giveaway'.

Beth mentioned that there did not seem to be any coverage from the TV Stations despite a phone call to her from WIN about three weeks prior to the event. (Comment: all TV stations were written to and were given the information for their Community Service Announcements. As we do not pay for these it is difficult to 'demand' that the ads be on).

Beth advised that the sale of tickets for the two seniors performances seemed to work well. It was suggested that Murray's name and phone number should be printed on the flyers etc. (Comments - as only 1 flyer / poster is printed to cover all of the performances, Murray would get phone calls on all dates even though we could indicate it was just for the matinees).

Seniors especially expressed disappointment that there was no Lucky Door Prize and both the audience from the matinees and the night performances were prepared to buy a ticket in a raffle.

Comments from members and partners:

1. John Kille will only be available in a consultancy position. We need to find others to assist with painting of the props etc.
2. Marketing: Not convinced that it worked as well as it could have.
3. 85% of the Club participated in some way.
4. Could we increase the cost of the show? Do we have to have supper?
5. We need to ensure that the quality of the supper is up to a standard. Some poor quality food and served cold.
6. Marketing Committee needs to start plans in November. They will need dates, times, costs etc.
7. Need to start rehearsals earlier and need to be much more disciplined.
8. Do we have the energy to do 2 more years of shows?
9. Around \$11,000 raised - do we really need to aim for a higher amount?
10. Don't think we could put the price up unless we were much more professional and had a much better supper.

11. \$11,000 profit was good especially as we didn't have an income from programs this year (this netted around \$1700 profit last year).

12. Can we use an overhead projector for some of the prop scenes?

13. Backstage. If there is a job to do then I will do it (Tony Wilson). Six people who mainly did all the work.

14. Very good social outlet for the performers - more opportunity to meet other members and cast.

15. A vote was taken and there was a majority for Music Hall to proceed for next year.



President Chris advised that he would like to see us in 'Rotary Uniform' when we are out in the public doing Community Service - e.g. Tulip Farm. This certainly helps when we are recruiting new members!
