Our Guest Speaker Andrew Kneebone gave an interesting and informative talk on the history and role of Cradle Mountain Water. Andrew has been appointed as Acting Chief Executive Officer and has had extensive experience in the water industry, predominantly in Victoria. Cradle Mountain Water has been formed as part of the State Government's reform of the Tasmanian water industry. Many employees from Burnie, Central Coast, Circular Head, Devonport, Kentish, King Island, Latrobe, Waratah-Wynyard and West Coast Councils have been transferred to Cradle Mountain Water. Cradle Mountain Water will return dividends to its owner councils. Services of Cradle Mountain Water include, sourcing raw water from catchment areas, treating and monitoring water quality, storing drinking water in dams and reservoirs, delivering drinking water to homes and businesses, collecting wastewater, treating and discharging wastewater, managing and maintaining assets, connecting customers to water and sewerage services, providing emergency water and sewerage solutions, facilitate and process development, building and plumbing applications - all of these so they can provide quality water and sewerage services and develop assets and processes over coming years.
