Meeting Held Monday 10th May

President Chris welcomed Marie Leicester (Rotary Club of Somerset), Ian Tolman (Husband of our Guest Speaker), Janet Sell (Guest of Sue Hope), Rebecca from Germany (Guest of Andy Nichols) and our Guest Speaker Dr. Jane Tolman.

P. Chris thanked everyone for their efforts with the Garage Sale and also advised that we have interest from a student for the National Youth Science Forum.

Fay announced that members have been invited to the R.Y.L.A dinner at Camp Clayton and Satish offered to represent our Club. Greg Smith sent an email from their holiday in Morocco. He has been having problems with the Arabic Keyboards, the pickpockets and the smells! We have 9 members attending the District Assembly in Launceston on Sunday - Chris Campbell, Ray Shires, Ellen Burn, Judy Taylor, Tony Boys, Doug Portors, Satish Kumar and Fay and Trevor Hopf.

GUEST SPEAKER - DR. JANE TOLMAN

Jane is a Geriatrician and native of Hobart who has returned to Tasmania after spending 16 years at the Prince of Wales Hospital at Randwick, Sydney and 2 years recently setting up the geriatric service in the Shoalhaven region on the NSW South Coast.

Jane's career background is originally in teaching. However, after a career change in the 1980's led her to study medicine at the University of Tasmania. Jane went on to gain specialist qualifications in Respiratory Medicine as well as Geriatrics. In June, 2006 she took up the newly established position of Director of Rehabilitation and Geriatric Services at the Royal Hobart Hospital.

Jane's topic was Alzheimer's Disease

Alzheimer's disease is an irreversible, progressive brain disease that slowly destroys memory and thinking skills, and eventually even the ability to carry out the simplest tasks. In most people with Alzheimer's, symptoms first appear after age 60.

Alzheimer's disease is the most common cause of dementia among older people. Dementia is the loss of cognitive functioning—thinking, remembering, and reasoning—to such an extent that it interferes with a person's daily life and activities. Jane said that as many as 5000 Tasmanians have dementia today and Jane said that there is a need for increased aged care services in our State as the statistics for this state are much higher than others.

Alzheimer's disease is named after Dr. Alois Alzheimer. In 1906, Dr. Alzheimer noticed changes in the brain tissue of a woman who had died of an unusual mental illness. Her symptoms included memory loss, language problems, and unpredictable behaviour. After she died, he examined her brain and found many abnormal clumps (now called amyloid plaques) and tangled bundles of fibres (now called neurofibrillary tangles). Plaques and tangles in the brain are two of the main features of Alzheimer's disease. The third is the loss of connections between nerve cells (neurons) in the brain.

Jane told us that it was very important to have regular exercise of body and brain, a good balanced diet and to give up smoking as there are clear indicators that if you smoke then you are more likely to get Alzheimer's. I believe Jane was one of the best Guest Speakers that we have had. Thank you to Sue for arranging this.

ROTARY INFORMATION - SATISH KUMAR

Satish put a lot of work into this segment with the topic of 'The History of Rotary in India'. He told us that Rotary first started in Calcutta in 1919. It was a slow start for Rotary in India however there are now more than 1654 Clubs in 28 Districts. During the last 85 years of Rotary's existence in India, several world leaders emerged from this region. Today there are over 70,000 Rotarians in India.

Trevor has witnessed first hand the work of Rotary in India during his 6 week visit to Calcutta as a GSE Team Leader. Many believe the Rotary Foundation gives far in excess to this region than what is raised - this is not a fact. Rotary Members and Clubs in India give more money to the Foundation than they ever receive in aid. Indian Rotarians are very generous with their time, resources and funds. Thank you Satish.
